(Also: • Colossians 4:16 After this letter has been read to you, see that it is also read in the church of the Laodiceans and that you in turn read the letter from Laodicea. • 1 Thessalonians 5:27 I charge you before the Lord to have this letter read to all the brothers. • Revelation 1:3 Blessed is the one who reads the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.)

**1** → What verse, verses, passage or theme in the letters to Timothy and Titus caught your attention, and why?

**2** → How does this instruct, sharpen or challenge your life-mission for tomorrow?

**4** → What are ways we can be confident that we're reading the Scriptures and interpreting them correctly? (HINT: *with* the church)
