Isaiah 53:3

John 11:32-36

**1** → Who is Jesus in reference to these passages? What can we learn from these descriptions of Jesus and His actions? Does this affect your view of 'church-happy,' the plastic kind?

Matthew 23:37-39

**2** → How does this fit, or does it fit, into mourning and weeping?

Luke 19:41-44

**3** → How can this be instructive to us in our response to being informed about what is happening around us? Does Jesus seem to approach news/happenings/circumstances of the day as aloof, or engaged, or distant, or apathetic, or as an activist, or something else? If something else, what might that something be?

John 16:33

**4** → This is a laughter verse. So, how is this a laughter verse? What can this tell us about this blessing in Luke 6, blessed are those who weep for you will laugh? Based on what Jesus says here, how can we find our 'laughing place' without 'forced laughter?'
