Luke 9:18-20 <sup>18</sup>Once when Jesus was praying in private and his disciples were with him, he asked them, “Who do the crowds say I am?” <sup>19</sup>They replied, “Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life.” <sup>20</sup>“But what about you?” he asked. “Who do you say I am?” Peter answered, “The Christ of God.”

John 14:6 Jesus answered, “I am the way and the truth and the life.

- 1 → Peter answered (Luke 9:20) with the truth. Does this mean Peter is living in the truth (John 14:6)?
- 2 → What does it mean to live truthfully? How is that different from telling the truth, or saying things that are true?
- 3 → Is it right to appeal to a person to believe in Jesus, and say true things, for the worldly benefits they will receive?
- 4 → How would you answer the person who said, “If Jesus works for you, that’s great, but He’s not for me”?
- 5 → What expectations of Christ did you have which He has not fulfilled? Were they True expectations?

**BONUS QUESTIONS:**

- 6 → Today is Trinity Sunday. How is Peter’s answer, “The Christ of God,” a Trinitarian expression?
- 7 → How is our discussion of Truth connected with, and/or represented by, what we know of our Triune God?
