



## Luke 10:25-37 *How Can I Live Forever?*

Cf: Luke 10:25-37

① → Over the last couple of weeks we've discovered based on the Greatest Commandment, the story of the Good Samaritan and John 13:35 "all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" that the church's primary mission is not to fix the world, but it is to cultivate a life together. That life together is the better place (not a "fixed" world) into which God invites all people.

✓ What is the difference between Kingdom work and work that is for the common good?

② → Explore this: Ephesians 2:10 For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

✓ How does this advance our thinking from ①?

✓ Remembering what the difference is between Kingdom work and work that is for the common good, what might our being "created in Christ Jesus to do good works" be saying?

③ → Describe the meaning of the story of the Good Samaritan in your own words, or, describe in your own words the answer to the question: "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

④ → How is this different than what meaning you gave this story (the Good Samaritan) or that question previously?
